Students to face off at UCC for Science Olympiad

CENTRAL JERSEY — Student teams fielded from middle and high schools statewide will take a day off Tuesday from their studies to compete in the regional level of the New Jersey Science Olympiad.

For the first time, the Cranford campus of Union County College will host the tournament -- a day-long event where teams and individuals vie to earn points by solving queries posed in the fields of biology, earth science, chemistry, physics, technology and problem solving.

Twenty-one middle school teams and 20 high school teams, each allowed to have 18 team members each, will rotate among classrooms that will pose various problems in subjects such as meteorology, the solar system, forensics, ecology, astronomy, anatomy, ornithology, among others, explained Nicole Torella, a spokeswoman at the college.

Ten winning middle and high school teams will continue on to the state level Olympiad.

"It's exciting to know that one or more of the teams that win TuesdayJan. 12 may go on to participate at higher levels of the competition," Torella said.

Initiated 27 years ago by Dr. Gerard Putzcq,iswear from Michigan and Dr. Jack Cains from Delaware to heighten interest in the sciences over and above the traditional school "science fair," the program now attracts more than 14,000 participating schools representing the United States, Mexico and Canada.

In addition to solving advanced science problems, the program emphasizes teamwork, group planning and cooperation among the support network of students, teachers, coaches, principals, parents and business partners necessary to reach competition level.
